

SILICON LABS AUSTIN MARATHON RELAY PARTICIPANTS RUNNING FOR FINANCIAL LITERACY

Race provides unique, fun format for runners and generates educational funds for Central Texas students

AUSTIN, Texas – September 25, 2011 – Today, Silicon Labs (NASDAQ:SLAB) and Junior Achievement announced another successful Austin Marathon Relay, Junior Achievement’s largest annual fundraiser and one of the country’s top relay events. The proceeds from the event support Junior Achievement’s efforts to inspire students in Central Texas to stay in school and achieve economic success as adults. This year’s race raised over \$100,000 for Junior Achievement, supporting financial education programs for at least 2,500 Central Texas students.

The winning team of Jack and Adam’s finished the 26.2 mile marathon distance in 2:12:03. The team consisted of Benjamin Kiplimo, Edward Kiptum, Justus Cherop, Drew Soucy and David Fuentes. This is the fifth year in a row for the Jack and Adam’s team to win the race.

Austin’s only five-person marathon relay, the race gives runners an opportunity to run among Austin’s skyline and admire Lady Bird Lake and the Capitol. The common exchange point for Relay runners at Auditorium Shores, provides a central location for family and friends to hang out while team members run their leg of the course while also enjoying local food vendors such as Amy’s Ice Cream and El Arroyo.

“Financial literacy is a very real problem in the U.S. and Junior Achievement is addressing this issue by educating young people about business, economics and free enterprise in Central Texas,” said Shannon Pleasant, Director of Corporate Communications at Silicon Laboratories and race participant. “We’re thrilled to be part of the Relay, a terrific event in a really special city, supporting a great cause.”

Junior Achievement of Central Texas, a non-profit organization, organizes the Silicon Labs Austin Marathon Relay each year to raise awareness of its youth financial literacy program.

“I always say it every year, but this year’s Relay was the best yet. I am so proud to be a part of such a supportive community here in Austin,” said Dave Swincher, president of Junior Achievement of Central Texas. “Every year I look forward to seeing all the runners, spectators, volunteers and sponsors come out and support our cause and what we believe in, and this year I wasn’t disappointed. This year’s race also introduced the adidas High School Challenge (HSC), an invitational for high school teams that signed up for the Relay. Those high school teams received a complimentary race entry, racing singlets, technical training t-shirts and footwear provided by adidas. Winners of this year’s cup included Vandergrift Girls Running Club with a time of 3:23:47 and the Pflugerville Panthers Boys Team with a time of 2:45:21.
